## What is the TMDL?

 A TMDL is a pollution diet required by the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for a waterway that is impaired (not fishable and/or swimmable). The EPA's authority is derived from the Clean Water Act.  The EPA has set the limits for nitrogen, phosphorus and sediment.


 The reductions are in large part determined by the Chesapeake Bay Model. (This is a series of models of varying focuses.)

• The TMDL is set for the entire watershed. This encompasses approximately 64,000 square miles and includes portions of six states.



## I've heard we're not in the Bay watershed. Is that true?

 Portions of the Eastern Shore are not in the watershed. These areas are on the seaside and the next slides show the dividing lines.

 on the drainage of your land.
