- In conjunction with the Virginia Tourism, A-NPDC staff will promote the winter 2018 Virginia Ecotour Guide Certification Course
- MPPDC staff will organize the YPM² project management team
- MPPDC staff will work with DCR, Mathews County, and the Virginia Tourism Corporation regarding trail maps; start transfer of Guinea Marshes to PAA
- NNPDC will convene Virginia Oyster Trail Digital Engagement Working Group to determine need and design task for interactive itinerary tool
- NNPDC will design and task website developer with itinerary tool project

April-June 2018:

- A-NPDC staff will organize the quarterly Rural Coastal Virginia Ecotourism Steering Committee
- A-NPDC will update data in the 2006 Seaside Water Trail continuing to meet with the Working Group quarterly and additional stakeholders and resource users/managers as needed
- In conjunction with the Virginia Tourism, the 2018 Virginia Ecotour Guide Certification Course will be offered through the Rappahannock and Eastern Shore Community Colleges
- MPPDC will insert spatial data into GIS to create maps, which will be shared with the Management Team
- MPPDC will map other assets and start gap analysis
- NNPDC Working Group will beta-test itinerary tool

July – September 2018:

- A-NPDC staff will organize the quarterly Rural Coastal Virginia Ecotourism Steering Committee
- A-NPDC will work through Best Management Practices Toolbox with the Working Group
- A-NPDC will incorporate generated information into both printed and online Trail resources
- MPPDC will work through Best Management Practices Toolbox with Management Team
- NNPDC Working Group will meet
- NNPDC will launch the tool on the website

- NNPDC will make final adjustments to the tool
- NNPDC will offer demonstrations for the tool
- All PDCs will wrap up projects and present the program to their respective Commissions
- All PDCs will promote their respective products intended for use by the public
