Meeting Minutes

1. Welcome

The Accomack-Northampton Planning District Commission (A-NPDC) staff hosted a meeting of the Working Waterfront Steering Committee on Tuesday, October 31st at 2pm at the Hampton Roads PDC. Those in attendance included Beth Polak and Laura McKay, Virginia Coastal Zone Management Program; John Bateman, Northern Neck PDC; Lewie Lawrence and Jackie Rickards (via Webinar) and Stephanie Heinatz (Consociate Media), Middle Peninsula PDC; Ben McFarland, Hampton Roads PDC; Curt Smith Clara Vaughn and Shannon Alexander, A-NPDC, and Susanna Musick, VIMS.

2. Legislation Discussion FY17

Feedback from coastal attorneys with regards to the limits, abilities, and similarity to an overlay district of the Working Waterfront Development Area were discussed.

Reference was made to the Shellfish/Aquaculture Group as an ally. No current push planned for the 2019 General Assembly unless there is a clear direction and champion for moving forward to recognition of the 2016 Virginia WWF Master Plan at the state level.

3. Comprehensive Plan Outreach Material FY17

Shannon Alexander presented the draft four pages and several edits and additions were suggested, including having the document as a 'living' document and altering the content slightly from region to region or jurisdiction to jurisdiction, as necessary to

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improve effectiveness and relevance.

4. Remaining FY17 Deliverables

Long-term funding options for the VOT. The PDCs and CZM representatives were invited to attend a VOT management team meeting.

5. Rural Coastal Virginia Community Enhancement Authority Summit FY18
